



## BEATLES FOOL THE PUBLIC WHO IS SINGING WHAT??

"In My Own Time," a cut from the Bee Gees' new album, has caused a stir of controversy. Although sources close to the Beatles have confirmed the suspicion that John Lennon and Paul McCartney are singing on the track, the Bee Gees have hedgingly denied the rumor.

Maurice Gibbs states, "but that song that we did on the album was written quite a while ago, and we just did it for the album, and I can't think of why people would even think that the Beatles would sing on the album."

Colin adds, "I don't even know the Beatles; and that would be very

difficult if they sang on one of our records. I'm sure I'd get to meet them or something. I think people, when a new group starts out, someone has to say something about them, you know, everyone feels the need to start as controversy. And this is what has been started about us. ## **Four Seasons**

LOS ANGELES - The Four Seasons came to the West Coast to perform in the area for the first time and completely conquered all who saw them In two different concerts, the accomplished group received the phenomenal standing ovations so rarely given a pop

Cornering the group at a beach party, they talked openly and freely about their music, their future, and the changes they've gone

The group has been going strong since 1962 and when asked how music has changed, Frankie Valli offered his thoughts, "I think there has been a lot of protest music. The world situation has had a great deal to do with the change I get the feeling that many of these songs derive from people's or writer's personal feelings about situations that are

Personal Feelings

"To some extent I would say that personal feelings affect our music. I think there have been many times when we've been pretty far ahead. For instance, in an album we did about two years ago, Bob (Gaudio) wrote a song which was called "Silence Is Golden and it is now a big hit by a grou m England. In an album we cause after a while it did get to be a drag. name 4 Seasons was not enough the boys have also recorded under the pseudonym. The Wonder Who. but the reasons behind this "false are unusual. Frankie explains that when they were record ng an album with Bob Dylan's 'Don't Think Twice," the idea came about. "We were in the studio and just kidding around a little, and everybody flipped ove the way we were doing it, so we recorded it that way. It was so different from anything that we had ever done, we said why not just for fun, put it out under a different name. And fun seemed to pay off quite a bit. Frankie is in the unique position

of having two hit records on the ton ten at one time. His own hit

Frankie feel the need to venture out on his own, while still remain ing with the group? "Well, I'd say many people had typed this group for doing a certain kind of thing However, the biggest reaction we had gotten when we worked college dates or nightclubs, where we do a variety of music, was some of the things we were not recording

way we went, as long as we were thinking of expanding, it couldn't burt any situation, as lone as there was separation between what I did and what the group was doing. This was I'd say the basic reason and with everybody sharing in the profits, we're just one happy College Dates

The 4 Seasons enjoy wide range popularity, never catering to one segment of the population in their music, but could this idea hold over when performing? Tommy deVido stated, "well, actually speaking for the group, as long as their attentive, and usually in colleges they're attentive. They're not drinking, and they're not ordering food and things like that, and you aren't hearing glasses tinkling all over the place, and waiters dropping trays. We kind of like colleges a little better than night But Frankie added, "I'd like to

say we throw no stones at night

clubs because basically our very early experience came from night clubs. It was sort of a show place to give us a chance to do the kind of music that we really felt. So I can't knock night clubs

"I really see our future in a combination of night clubs and concerts because the young college kid of today will be the night club goer of tomorrow. "I'll tell you, in my opinion, Lennon and McCartney are of our age what Cole Porter used to be 20 years ago," said Bob. "I really think they are fantastic writers they write some great things, and I think 10 or 20 years from now, they may be known and as popular as Cole Porter is now. I feel that way for maybe 50% of the music that is happening today. I also think there are going to be many many standards made now that you may not think will be standards, but 20 years from now they will be. There has to be new standards made because the standards of 20 or 30 years ago can't be going on for that long. The Hippie and the new psych

delic sound in music has affected everyone including the 4 Seasons but Frankie offered some rather outspoken remarks as to the Hippie Generation and the ability

If I can't understand it how can the public understand it? Unless they're just following and doing what everyone else is doing. But like I say, The many others are fantastic, and the have sort of taken this music and brought it to a point of commercialism so that everyone can understand and appreciate what they are doing. I mean if you're doing something that no one under-

stands, what's the sense in it? 'I also believe that many of these performers today are not really capable of performing. mean if an audience comes out to see you they expect to be enter tained and I have gone to several concerts where I have seen groups doing a great job musically, but not communicating with the public. You say, 'well, why, they're doing a great job,' but it's because they seem very disinterested in what they're doing or so complete ly hung up or involved that they

#### Night Clubs

"I can remember, it's only a few short years ago we went out and decided that we should get a night club act. We spent about \$10,000 for it and not too long ago we junked it completely. It was a good night club act, but it wasn't us and we decided that the only way to municate was to be yourself, and never be afraid of being yourself. When we made this change it worked out well "I don't say that we've found

it to the extent that we've given up searching for new things. I think there's a constant need for changes in the different material that you use and I'd say that we stay on top of it pretty well. We rehearse a lot when we get the opportunity, and I think that's what's really helped us quite a bit
